Dear Sisters of Alpha Nu,

For those of us who grew up in the 1940s, 50s, and 60s, the Three R's were "readin', ritin', and 'rithmetic." For current NC DKG members, the Three R's are "recruitment, retention, and reinstatement," our state organization's president's focus for her tenure. With membership in DKG International declining at an alarming rate, President Beth Winstead wants each chapter to increase its membership, not for the sake of numbers but to recognize the many outstanding women educators who are "out there" just waiting to be asked and bring them into an organization that "promotes (their) professional and personal growth...," which is the mission of the DKG International Society.

Last week, I visited an elementary school and was privileged to meet and chat with some of the teachers there. I spent about 45 minutes with these ladies and walked out with TWO potential candidates for membership. When I asked them why they were not already "one of us," they both replied, "We've never been asked." (Even though they were both aware of "us," they simply had not been asked.)

Women educators worthy of membership are right "under our noses," down the hall in our workplaces, in our neighborhoods, in our churches, and, yes, even in our own families. We have a responsibility to recognize them and bestow on them the same honor and privilege someone gave to us.

I know very well that everyone in our chapter doesn't bleed crimson and gold, DKG's official colors, when poked, and I know everyone isn't comfortable being a "recruiter" for Alpha Nu/NC DKG. No problem! Send the person's name to one of us who is comfortable asking qualified women educators ("them") to be a part of "us."



### Alpha Nu Community Support Project: Christmas in November!

Here are the details regarding our "*Christmas in November*" project for West Lenoir Elementary School. Kelly Beavers, a member of Alpha Nu, teaches at the school. Kelly has spoken to the principal about the school's current specific needs, and they have identified two categories.

First, there is a need for larger sizes of children's clothes to stock the school's *Clothes Closet*. Second, the school offers a *Christmas Store* where students may purchase items for their family as Christmas presents. Many of these items are donated by staff/ volunteers.

Students love this opportunity to buy items at a low cost (\$0.25 - \$2.00) for their loved ones! Money received is used to buy additional items for students to buy.

The NC DKG Convention, to be held in Asheville, April 29 to May 1, 2022, is seeking volunteers to help make the convention run smoothly.


Convention Chair Connie Savell is ready to make connections with members across the state and is offering everyone the unique opportunity to network and connect by volunteering behind the scenes this year.



Condolences to Kathy Starnes whose mother, Edna Starnes Millsaps, passed away on November 13.


So grateful that **Terri Mull** got good results from her recent CT scan. Tumors are getting smaller and no new ones were evident! Please keep her in your prayers.
